providing discounts to eligible low-income consumers to help them establish and maintain phone and broadband service

You may be eligible for assistance in paying your telephone bill if you receive benefits from certain low-income assistance programs. For more information or an application form, please contact Solix at 888-627-4255. They will do the verification process with you over the phone and can provide you with an application.

Minnesota’s Telephone Assistance Plan (TAP) offers a monthly credit of \$3.50 on your landline telephone service plan. You may receive the TAP credit on one landline per household.

The federal Lifeline Program offers a monthly discount of \$9.25 on some landline telephone service plans. Lifeline also offers discounts on some wireless telephone service plans and some broadband internet service plans. You may receive the Lifeline discount on one telephone service per household.

The federal Lifeline Program incorporates the broadband discount (not applicable to TAP).

If you live on Tribal lands, you may qualify for additional discounts. Tribal Lands Link Up offers a one-time credit of up to \$100 on installation or activation charges. Tribal Lands Lifeline offers a monthly credit of up to \$34.25 on your landline or wireless telephone service plan.

The telephone or broadband service must be in your name. You must show proof that you or a member of your household participates in at least one of the following programs or is income eligible:

- Federal Public Housing Assistance
- Food Support/Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Medicaid/Medical Assistance
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Veterans Pension or Survivors Pension Benefit
- Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance and living on Tribal lands
- Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) and living on Tribal lands
- Tribally Administered Head Start (for those meeting income-qualifying standards) and living on Tribal lands
- Tribally Administered Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TTANF) and living on Tribal lands

DECEMBER

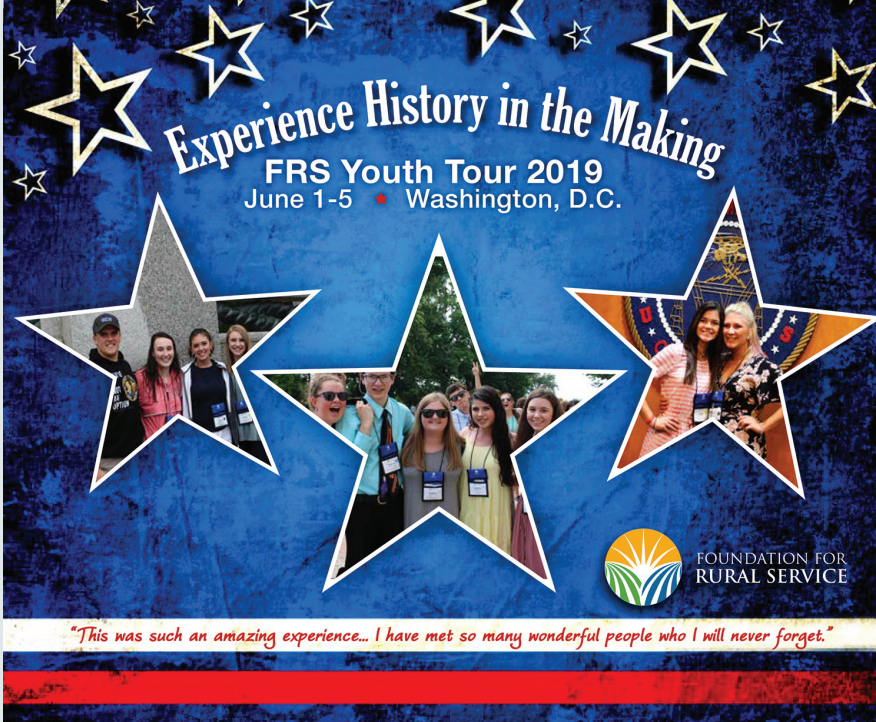

2019 CAUCUS MEETING DATE SET

DISTRICT 5 - TUESDAY, APRIL 2
7:00 PM AT THE HELGA COMMUNITY CENTER (OLD NARY SCHOOL)
THIS CAUCUS IS ONLY OPEN TO MEMBERS OF THE COOP FROM DISTRICT 5

The purpose of the caucus meeting is to nominate a director candidate or candidates to represent your district on the Paul Bunyan Communications Board of Directors. The current director from your district is Randy Frisk, Board Vice President and he will be seeking re-election. Directors serve a five-year term, with District Five's next term expiring in the year 2024. Once a person or persons are nominated at the district meeting, up to two names are put onto a ballot and voted on by the general membership of the Cooperative. Votes are tallied at the Annual Meeting, and results are announced at that time. Nominees with the greatest numbers of votes from the general membership will be elected Director for the district. This caucus is only open to current members from within District Five.

Please be aware of the cooperative caucus voting rules of one vote per membership and how that applies to married couples, businesses, etc. This includes understanding who is authorized on your account and therefore eligible to vote at the caucus. Often times a husband or wife may sign up for service but not put the other spouse on the account and establish "joint membership". In that instance, per the cooperative's bylaws, only the individual who is on the account is

authorized to vote. If you have any questions about your voting eligibility for these caucuses, please call our offices.

Please refer to these qualifications when you consider your nominations for a Director to represent your district or consider becoming a candidate yourself.

In addition to being an opportunity to nominate persons to represent the district, your caucus meeting is also an opportunity for you to ask questions concerning the cooperative. The meeting will be attended by several key management staff.
