# Celebrating 70 years on January 29

In the late 1940's many areas of northern Minnesota still didn't have access to landline telephone service, they were too far away from a "city". That was about to change. In 1949, the United States Congress enacted legislation to add a new program to improve rural telephone service in the U.S.

On February 28, 1950 the first public organizational meeting to explain the new telephone program was held at the Bemidji Armory and less than two years later on January 29, 1952, the bylaws to establish the cooperative were incorporated, making that the Cooperative's official first day.

After incorporation of the bylaws, our founders worked endlessly to make the cooperative a reality, including selling memberships for \$40 each (\$40 in 1949 is equivalent to about \$465 today).

To qualify for the new federal loan program, the Board had to operate an existing telephone system before



the loan could be approved so in early June of 1954, the Kelliher Telephone Company and Hendrickson Township Telephone's system in Hubbard County were purchased. Days later, on June 14, 1954, the first REA Telephone Program federal loan was approved. Four years and countless hours of effort had finally paid off. The cooperative was open and operating.

On February 22, 1955, Paul Bunyan Telephone opened its first business office at 207 4th Street in Bemidji behind what is now Tara Thai Restaurant. The cooperative's first full year of service ended with a total of 208

What was started by a few farmers from Kelliher and Laporte has grown into the largest broadband cooperative in Minnesota with over 23,000 members and providing services over one of the largest rural all-fiber optic gigabit networks in the United States!

### OVEMBER

Paul Bunyan Communications Board of Directors conducted its monthly meeting on November 1, 2021. Also attending were CEO and General Manager Gary Johnson, CFO Dave Schultz and Administrative Assistant Kalsie Vanasse.

- Financial reports, delinquent accounts, member lists, and other service reports were reviewed and approved
- The CEO provided an update on our COVID-19 operations and plans.
- The CEO updated the board on the contract negotiations with the Communications Workers of America (CWA) labor union. After discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and carried approving the new threeyear contract as presented pending union ratification.
- Long-time District 3 Director Kathy Peterson announced her upcoming retirement from the Board of Directors effective January 1, 2022. Director Peterson was elected in 1995 and served as President from 1998-2019. The Board appointed Tracy Mistic-Schaar, pending confirmation of eligibility, to serve as District 3 Director until an election is held next year.
- Network Operations Manager Rob St Clair provided a construction update and plans for 2022 construction and expansion.
- CFO Dave Schultz reviewed Olsen Thielen's Agreement for Services for conducting the 2021 audit and related
- The 2022 NTCA Rural Telecom Industry Meeting was discussed. Attendees and voting delegates were ap-
- The CEO gave his monthly report. He reviewed meetings he attended and upcoming meetings. He gave an update on the federal Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) approval process and status.

### **ENROLLMENT NOW OPEN ON FCC AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM**

The Affordable Connectivity Program is a Federal Communications Commission program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service. This new benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers\*.

Eligible households can enroll through Paul Bunyan Communications or directly with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) using an online or mail in

### **BOARD OF DIRECTOR ELECTIONS**

As a cooperative, Paul Bunyan Communications is governed by a seven-person member-elected Board of Directors. In 2022, there are Board of Directors positions up for election representing Districts 3, 7, and 9.

Article III, Section 3 of your Cooperative's Bylaws requires any member interested in serving as a Director to submit a candidate packet to the Cooperative headquarters at least 25 business days prior to the Caucus Election date. This enables the Cooperative to properly verify the eligibility of all candidates to serve as a member of the Board if elected. If there are less than two pre-qualified candidates seeking election/re-elction to the Board of Directors from the same district (an uncontested district election), no in-person Caucus and Caucus Election for that district will be held.

If there are two or more pre-qualified candidates seeking election from the same district, the in-person Caucus will be held and all members residing within the district will be notified by mail of the caucus date, time, and location. The purpose of the in-person Caucus is to select two pre-qualified candidates to seek election/re-election to be the district's representative on the Paul Bunyan Communications Board of Directors. Directors serve a five-year term through 2027, however in the case of District 3, the election will fill the remaining four years of the existing term ending in 2026.

THE CURRENT DIRECTOR FOR DISTRICT 7 is Board Secretary Bruce Campbell and he has expressed his intent to seek re-

THE CURRENT DIRECTOR FOR DISTRICT 9 is Board Treasurer Tim Hins and he has expressed his intent to seek re-election.

THE CURRENT DIRECTOR FOR DISTRICT 3 is Tracy Schaar and she has expressed her intent to seek re-election.

Based on the results of any contested Caucus Election, the names of two candidates are listed on the ballot to be voted on by the general membership of the Cooperative. Votes are tallied at the Annual Meeting, scheduled for May 25, 2022. The candidate from each respective district with the greatest number of votes from the general membership is elected/re-elected as the Director for such district.

### **DISTRICT 3 DIRECTOR**



At the monthly meeting in November, the Paul Bunyan Communications Board of Directors accepted Kathy Peterson's retirement notice and appointed Tracy Mistic Schaar to fill the District 3 seat.

We thank Kathy for her dedication by serving over 25 years on our cooperative's Board of Directors! Kathy was first elected in 1995 and led our cooperative as Board President for an incredible 20 years from 1998-2018.

So much has been accomplished in the two and a half decades Kathy has been on the Board of Directors it is hard to put into words. Our cooperative has grown significantly in membership, employees, and the technology and services we offer. When Kathy first started on the Board, Paul Bunyan Net was just formed to offer dial up Internet service, cellular service was transitioning from bag phones to flip phones, and there was no such thing as Paul Bunyan Television, high speed Internet, or the GigaZone. It was under Kathy's leadership that Paul Bunyan Communications developed into one of the most progressive communications cooperatives in the United States now providing an industry-leading multiple gigabit Internet service across 6,000 square miles of northcentral Minnesota.


